# CHAIRPERSONS REPORT

I am pleased to present the Chairperson's Report for 2025 for the Hutt Old Boys Marist Rugby Football Club. As noted in last year's report, community rugby continues to face a number of challenges, and our club has not been immune to these. Despite this, 2025 has been a year filled with significant achievements, and we can all take pride in what has been accomplished.

## Highlights

- **Jubilee Cup Winners** - It has been a long time between drinks, and securing this prestigious trophy has been a true milestone for the club. Watching the Premiers throughout the season has been a joy—they were deserving finalists and enjoyed the celebrations for a long time after the win.
- **McBain Shield Winners** - Always a special moment when we bring this trophy home.
- **Club Chaplain** - This year we introduced the role of Club Chaplain to provide pastoral care and support to our players. We are grateful to Lise Soloa, who has embraced this role with positivity, care, and genuine commitment.
- **Gym Floor Maintenance** - With the support of trust funding and LT McGuinness, we completed major repairs to the gym floor and upgraded the gym matting—improving the space significantly for our players.
- **Players' Room** - Thanks to Kent's vision and dedication, the players' room has been revamped and is now a vibrant and well-used space throughout the season.

## Challenges

- **Sponsorship and Grant Funding** - This has been our most significant challenge in 2025. While we are fortunate to have loyal sponsors who continue to back us, the economic climate has had an impact. Our sponsorship team has worked tirelessly despite these pressures. Grant funding has also become increasingly competitive, with more groups seeking support from smaller funding pools. For the first time, we experienced several declines before approvals, which affected the total funding available for the Director of Rugby role.
- **Cost Management and Revenue** - The management committee has regularly reviewed cost-saving opportunities and ways to increase income. For 2026 we have implemented savings in insurance and utilities and are seeing a small increase in revenue from higher clubroom and Green Room bookings. Planning for next year is underway, with a full review of operations, potential subscription adjustments, and new revenue opportunities. Every small saving or increase in revenue will make a difference.

Over recent years, we have invested heavily in maintaining and improving our facilities. The clubrooms and Green Room are now in excellent condition, and we do not anticipate any major capital works in the near future.

Special thanks to Mike Halley, ESC Trustees and ESC members for the continued financial support provided to the club. Their support directly contributes to our player development and our relationship with local college rugby programmes.

All teams across the club have enjoyed success this season, as outlined in the Director of Rugby's report. I have had the pleasure of watching games across all grades and have been

proud to see the camaraderie within teams and across our wider club community. *Soar as One* truly reflects the way our teams train, play, and support one another. I would like to thank all coaches and managers for their commitment, expertise, and the time they contribute.

We are extremely fortunate to have Kent Harris as our Director of Rugby. His work in coaching and player development—both within the club and across many local schools—is invaluable. This role is essential to the ongoing success of HOBM, and we must continue to prioritise it in our budgeting and work toward long-term sustainability. Maintaining strong coaching and development pathways, both in the club and in our local colleges, is vital for the future of rugby in our community.

Work is in progress on developing a new Constitution to ensure that we are compliant with the requirements of the Incorporated Societies Act and the New Zealand Rugby Union constitution. A Special General Meeting will be held in 2026 to endorse the new Constitution before 1 April.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our sponsors, members, volunteers and management committee for your unwavering support throughout the year.

As 2026 approaches, I am motivated by the challenges and opportunities that await us, we will continue to Soar as One.

# TREASURERS REPORT

## Overview Profit and Loss

- The Senior club recorded an overall net loss of \$41k for the 2025 season after providing for non-cash charge for depreciation of \$13k (*2024 profit of \$1.6k*).
- The cash operating loss excluding non-cash depreciation charge of \$13k was \$28k (*2024 \$14k operating profit*)
- Lower Sponsorship Income -\$30k and Grant funding received towards the Director of Rugby costs -\$20k, largely contributed to the deficit for the year.
- Sponsorship and Grant income combined contribute ~80% of the club's total income.
- Income from Sponsorship was \$112k this year. The tough economic times experienced by a number of the club's sponsors resulted in lower receipts from some of the clubs larger sponsors. These reductions were cushioned by the recruitment of 3 new sponsors. Special mention to the Sponsorship subcommittee for their continued great work, especially during these tough economic times for businesses and for arranging and promoting the recent successful Golf fundraiser.
- Grants Income from the gaming trusts is another vital source of funding for the club with grants received for the 2025 season totaling ~ \$100k as follows :
  - Director of Rugby \$19k; (*2024 \$40k*)
  - Operations (Preseason, Affiliation, Gear, Equipment etc.) \$49k;
  - Clubroom structural repairs \$30k:
- Special mention to the club's Grants Officer, Stephen Bradshaw, for his expertise, commitment and flexibility that he continues to bring to this role.
- The Eagles Supporters Club "ESC" continue to provide valuable financial contribution towards conditions, preseason and player analysis and development and providing funding to the club's feeder colleges for promotion of their Rugby.
- The annual golf fundraiser, which normally takes place early in the season, was rescheduled to after the completion of the 2025 season to put a gap on the club's funding demands on the club's sponsors. A very successful day was held in October, raising ~ \$10k with \$5k received prior to the September year end and the balance received after the club's year end in October.
- Income from Bar operations was up due largely due to great nights following the Jubilee Cup win and the home McBain Shield game.
- The collection of player subscriptions went well. The chairman, team managers and the players all played their part in another respectable outcome.

## Investment

- The club invested \$20k largely: playing equipment, new batteries and charger for the Golf Cart, IT enablers & equipment and other assets.
- Capital City Motors kindly donated the ownership of the van to the club during the season.

## Property

- Clubrooms & Greenrooms independently valued for insurance purposes at replacement cost of \$3.815m
- This latest replacement cost is included in the club's balance sheet as information members should be aware of and it is a source of cost, particularly insurance, rates & maintenance.
- Special thanks to LT McGuinness for the strengthening work completed on the clubrooms.

## Financial Matters Subsequent to Year End

- Approval of a grant funding application for the out-of-season insurance costs of \$7k
- Approval of grant funding for out of season electricity costs of \$5k
- The club has renegotiated its insurance cover, to exclude earthquake cover which has reduced the cost of the club's annual insurance cost by ~\$12k.
- Application lodged with a gaming trust for the clubs 2026 season cost of the Director of Rugby.
- Special meeting of the new committee is scheduled for early December to explore opportunities to enhance club income and to review the club costs where potential savings can be made.

# DIRECTOR OF RUGBY REPORT

After such a successful season, it is a pleasure to present the 2025 Director of Rugby Report. The club continues to stand strong both on and off the field, and this year's campaigns and results reflected the hard work being done in the background and on the training fields. We again fielded five senior teams across the variety of grades, with each experiencing their own challenges and successes, but all contributing strongly to our club culture and identity. Each team was well resourced and established for numbers which shows the strong position we are in as a club.

Our Premier side most notably won our first Jubilee Cup since 2014. Starting the season with an away trip against the Napier Pirates, we were able to blood in a number of young players throughout the campaign and show impressive growth. After reclaiming the McBain Shield, the Premiers went on to finish in the Top 4 of the Swindale Shield. From there they were able to sneak past the previously unbeaten Ories to secure a home semi-final (for the 4th time in 5 years) and earning a week off in which we had the opportunity to train against the French international side. After going close in recent seasons, the Premiers were able to break their semi-final draught and book a place against Tawa in the final. The rest they say, is history!

The Premier Reserves once again battled away through the season, hitting their straps towards the back end. With a mix of young and experienced players, this group is the backbone the club and a regular production line for our Premier side. Notching up 9 wins in the first round, they finished in 6th place on the ladder and were able to upset MSP in the quarterfinals. They went down in a hard battle against Petone in the semi-finals.

Our Colts again proved competitive, losing only 1 game in the round-robins and finishing a close second. The team once again was full of new school leavers who showed that the future is bright for our club's talent pool. While regularly providing players across the higher grades, the Colts managed to play an attractive game of rugby and win a number of games close to the club's heart - such as retaining the McGuinness Shield. Unfortunately, the Colts would fall short in the semi-finals after surrendering a lead to Tawa in the last minutes of the match.

Our U85's were unable to repeat their success of last season but were more than competitive in the Tony O'Brien Shield. They had some notable wins throughout the campaign- such as their scalp against OBU. Team morale was consistently positive, and player numbers were deep throughout, showing a thriving culture and enjoyable environment for our players.

The Presidents were once again impressive on and off the field. They managed to notch up 9 wins across the first round, finishing in second place, and finishing strongly against Stokes Valley in the final to take out the Grade.

The efforts of our players were well acknowledged in our selections for the representative sides. We were able to achieve 4 players in the Wellington U19's, 3 in the Horowhenua-Kapiti Heartland, 6 in the Wellington Centurions and 5 Wellington Lions - including debut appearances for Vili Tauofaga and Kapu Broughton-Winterburn. This is testament to the talent coming through and the success of our development opportunities at the club. Our coaches Otto and Aiden were also involved in the Wellington U19's.

We look forward to next year with an encouraging outlook. We continue to have strong connections with our local feeder schools and anticipate a good degree of new players coming to the club next season. With a mix of young players coming through the ranks, there are opportunities for players to put their hand up to earn positions and further add to Eagles rugby. We have a good level of continuity within our coaching ranks, along with a couple of quality additions and internal promotions. Finally, I would like to thank all players, coaches, managers, physios, volunteers and supporters for their efforts this season. To those who assisted with field setup, turned up to games, or organized after matches—your contributions, though often unseen, are greatly appreciated. With the talent on hand and the dedication of our management crew, we are well positioned to continue success both on and off the field in 2026!

# JUNIORS

With 311 registered junior players this year we see a slight increase in playing numbers. Playing numbers in the junior space has been raised as a concern with WRFU and is shared with all other clubs in the Wellington region. Several initiatives will be investigated and implemented during the 2026 season focused on player recruitment and retention.

There were 18 rounds of rugby scheduled in the junior space with only two games cancelled due to weather and ground closures. Both the Paraparaumu and the Paremata-Plimmerton exchanges had to be cancelled this year, one due to weather and the other due to Paraparaumu unable to gather enough players/teams.

The girls had a successful season with our first all-girl tackle team (Y5) as well as two rip teams we had approximately 40 girls playing rugby at HOBM this season. HOBM Girls played in 3 tournaments, starting with the Para-Plim 7s then onto Rahui Royale in Otaki before attending the NZ Junior Girls Rugby festival hosted by Global Games which was held in Lower Hutt this year.

The WRFU in association with NZ Rugby have a big focus on women's rugby and we are fortunate enough to have Adam Broster selected to join the WRFU Woman and Girls Advisory Group.

A big shoutout and thanks to our wonderful sponsors.

# EAGLES SUPPORTERS CLUB REPORT

The Eagles Supporters Club is a vehicle for individual club members to contribute financially to HOBM RFC and is separate from corporate sponsorship of the Club. All Eagles Supporters Club members are automatically honorary members of the Club. There are three membership levels depending on the amount of financial contribution which is set at either of \$10 (Silver), or \$20 (Gold) or \$50 (Platinum) per month.

The Eagles Supporters Club primary objective is to “assist the main club committee maintain a financially secure and sustainable rugby club and maintain the goal of being the leading and most professionally run rugby club within Wellington rugby”. Practically speaking - this is achieved via funding from the Eagles Supporters Club for the likes of player and coaching development, assisting with new or replacement capital assets the Club requires, providing training resources, supporting the Clubs rugby programmes and Colleges. And not least, to assist with building a strong sense of community and belonging to the Club by and for our members.

Funding requests are initiated via formal application to the Eagle Supporters Club Trustees and all requests must firstly meet Eagles Supporters Club objectives and secondly Wellington Rugby Union by laws.

Distributions for the year ended 30 September 2025 numbered 7 and totalled \$12,080 (7 distributions were funded in 12 months ended 30 September 2024 totalling \$16,029). Individual distributions for 2025 are detailed below.

Total Eagles Supporters Club annual member contributions under its current structure (since 1 January 2015) as at 30 September 2025, total \$141,460 (includes interest earned on members funds).

Total approved distributions over the same relevant period total \$135,557 (excludes any costs).

The Eagles Supporters Club experienced a reduction in members for YE 2025 ending the year with 39 members compared with 42 for YE 2024 an overall net loss of 3 members. On behalf of the Eagles Supporters Club Trustees and indeed the HOBM RFC Committee, a sincere thank you for your continued support of our Club. Total annual member contributions plus interest from 1 October 2024 to 30 September 2025 amounted to \$11,192 (\$12,791 for the previous year). Well done to each of you. Simply brilliant.
